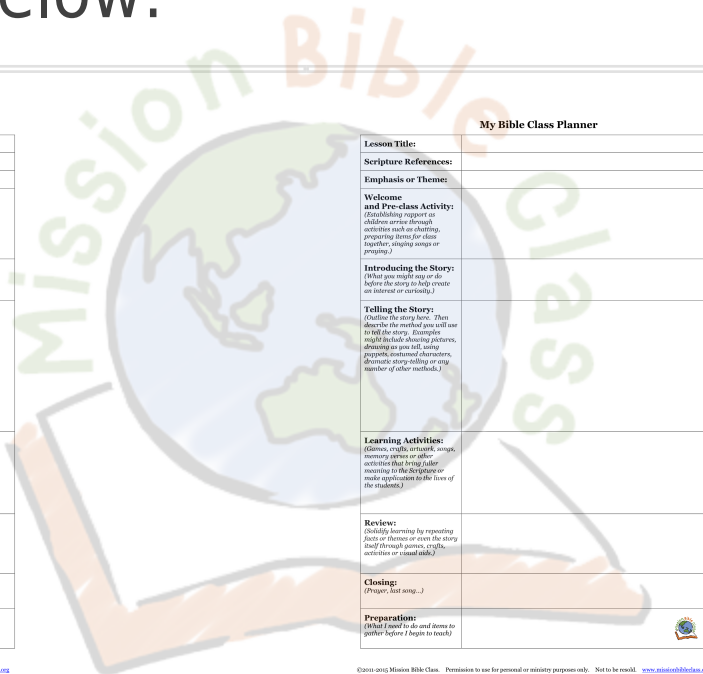

Telling the Story: (Outline the story here. Then describe the method you will use to tell the story. Examples might include showing pictures, drawings or puppets, using puppets, costume characters, dramatic story-telling or any number of other methods.)	
Learning Activities: (Games, crafts, artwork, songs, memory verses or other activities that bring life meaning to the Scripture or make application to the lives of the students.)	
Review: (Solidify learning by repeating facts or themes or even the story itself through games, crafts, activities or visual aids.)	
Closing: (Prayer, last song...)	
Preparation: (What you need to do and items to gather before I begin to teach)
