Kids love games and they can enhance any class. Almost any game can be adapted to fit with your lesson. As a rule of thumb, if the game brings out the Bible truth then it is a good learning game. If the children's focus is more on the game than the truths we are learning then I wouldn't use a lot of my teaching time on it.

That said, from time to time we'll play "lighter" games the children love just because it is good fellowship time.
